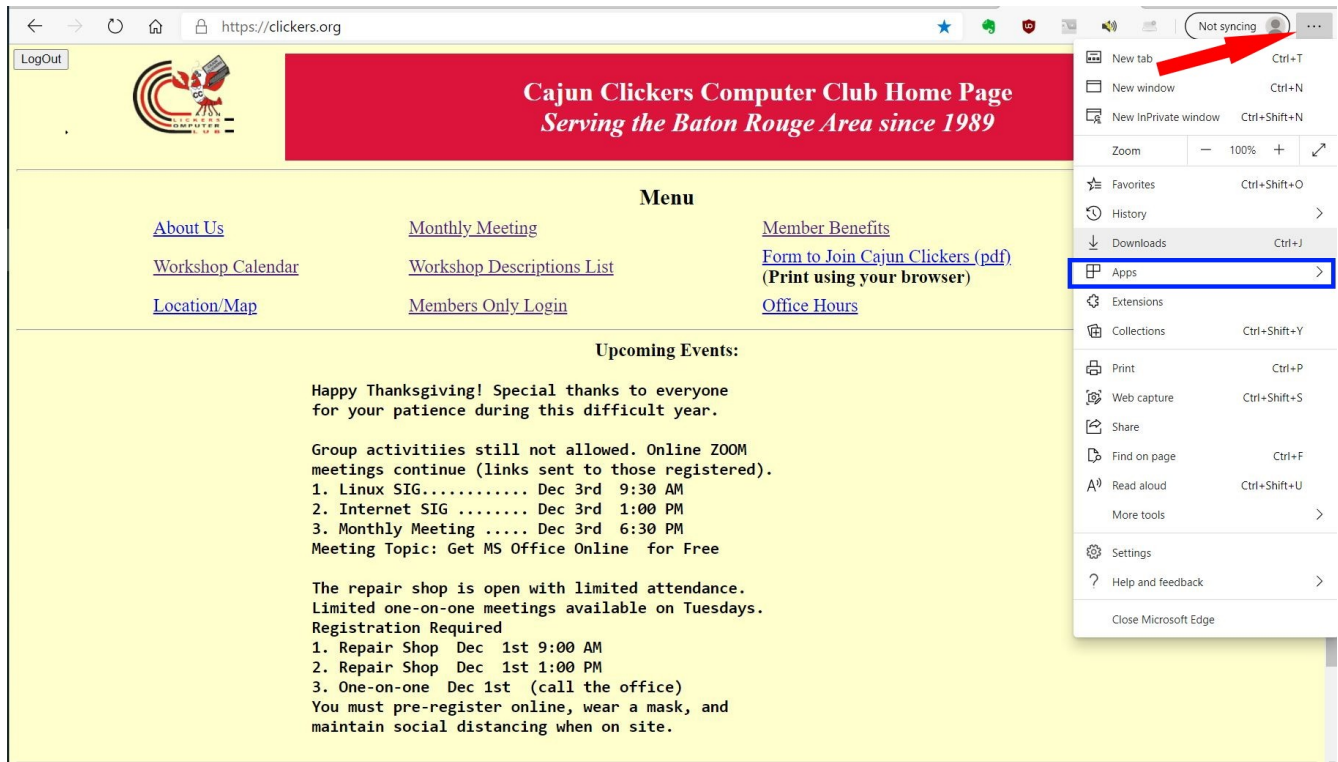


This tutorial will show you how to create a website as an app using the Edge browser. This feature is helpful when you frequently visit a website. Installing it as an app allows you to open it directly from your desktop or Start Menu without having to open the browser.

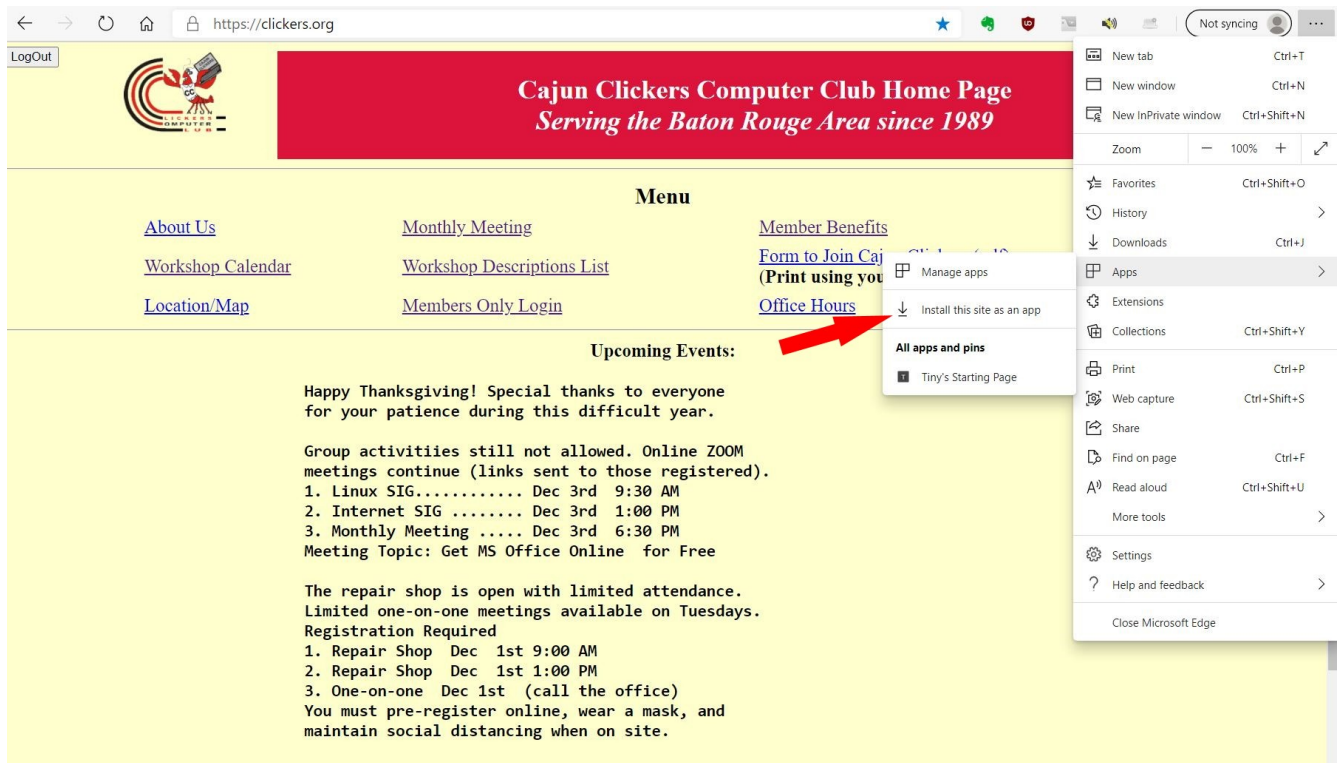
In this tutorial, I will create a web app of the Cajun Clickers web site.

1. Open the site (<https://clickers.org/>) in your Edge Browser.
2. Click on the menu (three dots) in the upper right corner.
3. Then move your mouse to the Apps section of the menu.

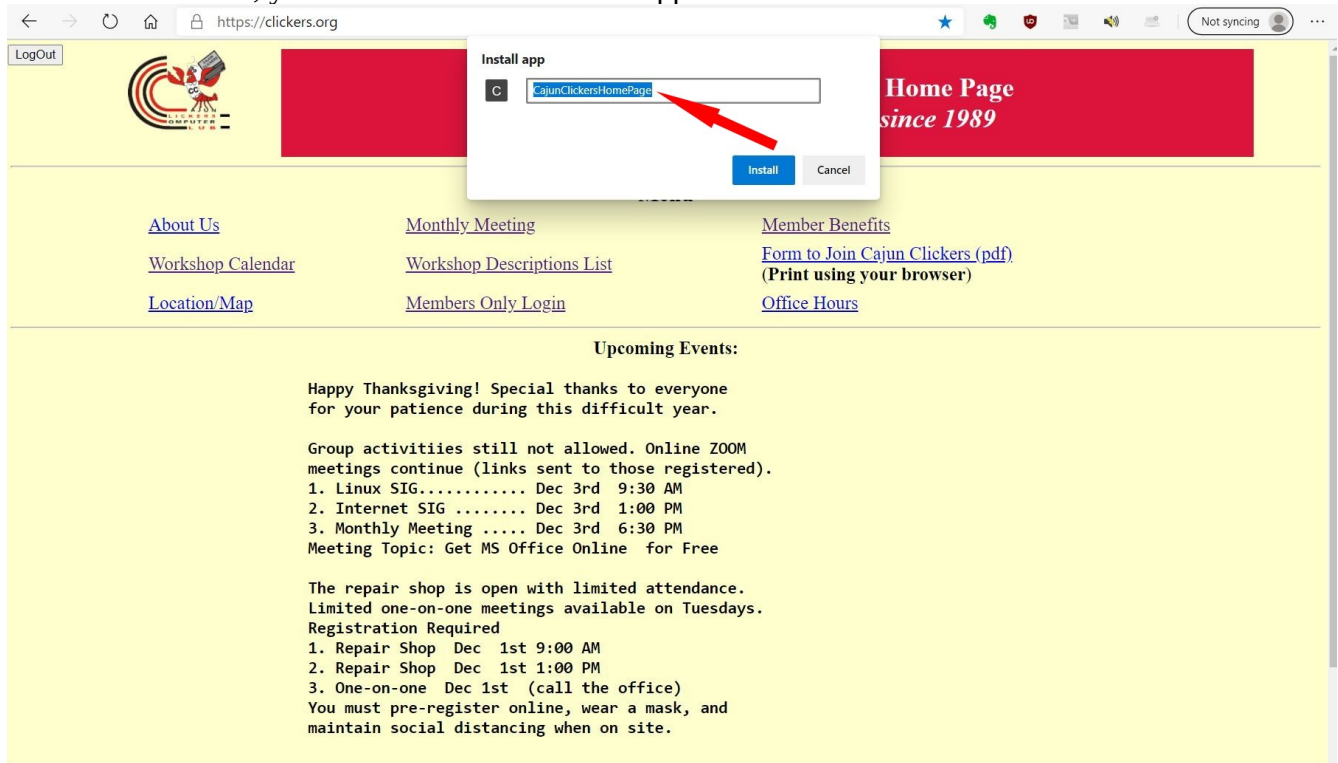

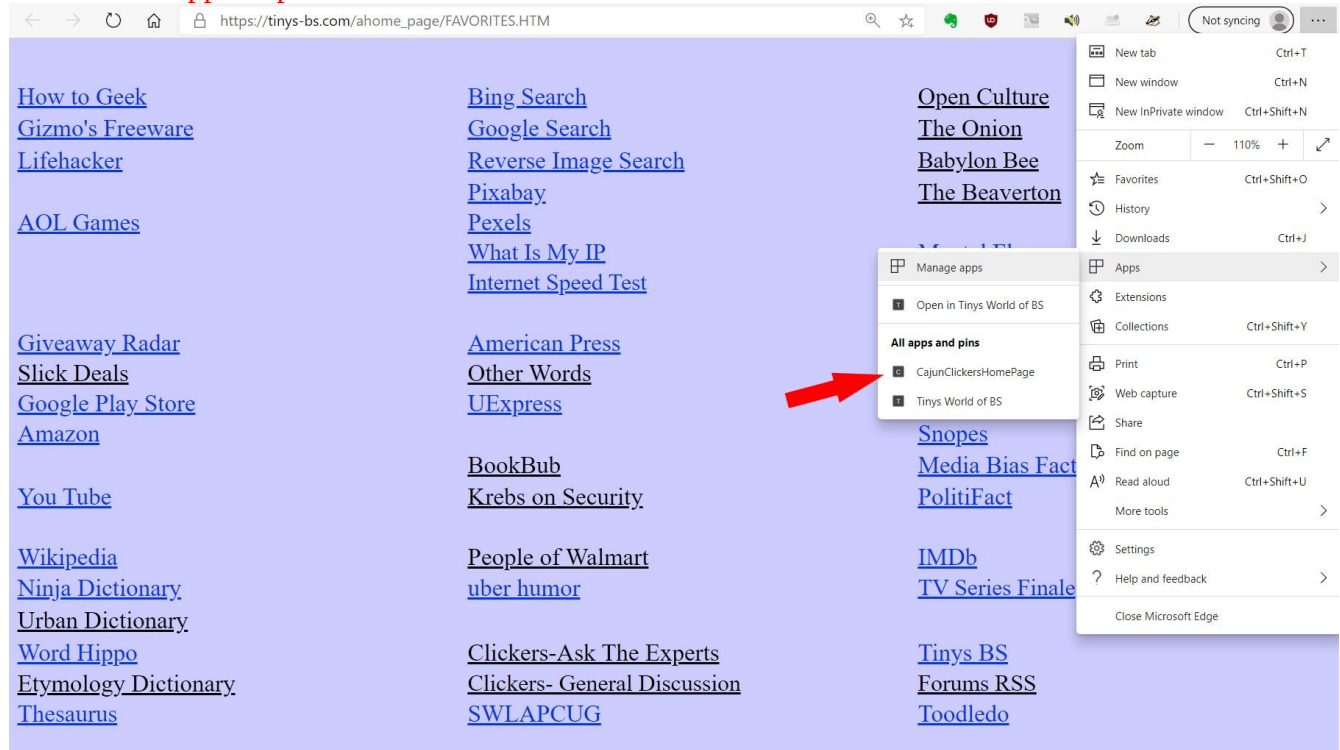
A new window will pop up.
Select "Install this site as an app"



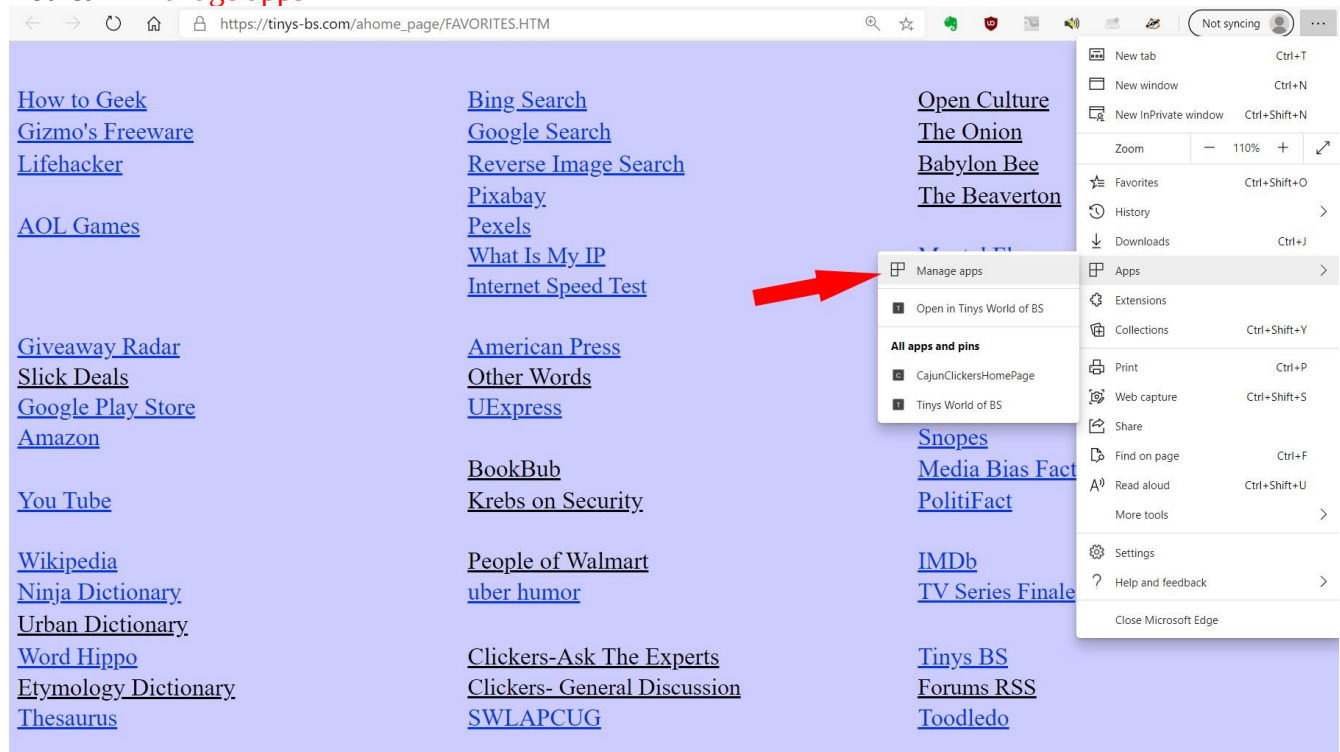
In the next window, you can name and install the app



After the app is created, you can use it like any installed program.
You can pin the app to your Start Menu or Task Bar.
The easiest way to open the app is from the browser menu Apps Section.
Click on the app to open.

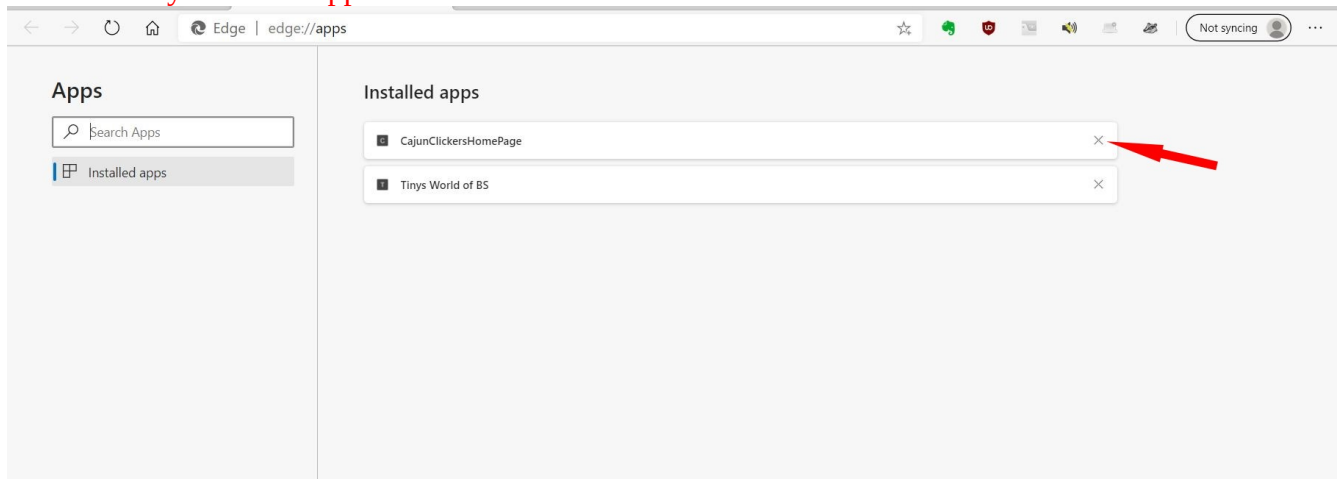


You can **“Manage apps”**



A new window will open that lists all of the apps you have created. There are several things you can do

1. Search for an app – useful if you have created many apps.
2. Drag and Drop to rearrange the order of your apps.
3. **Easily delete an app.**



Keep in mind that when you use a Web App, it will look like you have opened a browser window. You are actually opening an application window.
